 WHITE CEDAR	40-70 Ft. Tree, green foliage in fan-like sprays ( <i>Thuja occidentalis</i> )	Tolerates variety of conditions	H,S,E,N,T, WD
 BALSAM FIR	60 Ft. Delightful fragrance & symmetrical ( <i>Abies balsamea</i> )	Moist well drained soils, full sun	C,H,S,T,E,N
 DOUGLAS FIR	70 -200 Ft. Flowers open in late March and April. Leaves are densely set, needle-like with blunt tips ( <i>Pseudotsuga menziesii</i> )	Tolerates variety of soils, full sun	C, T, H, W, E

 PERIWINKLE	Dark green glossy ground cover, violet flowers in spring. Prefers moderately well drained soil, partial shade ( <i>Vinca minor</i> )		
 PACHYSANDRA	Attractive evergreen ground cover, excellent for shady areas, tolerates drought & acid soils if well-drained ( <i>Pachysandra terminalis</i> )		
AGRIFORM FERTILIZER TABLETS	20-10-5 designed to root feed evergreen & hardwoods for up to 2 years, time released
