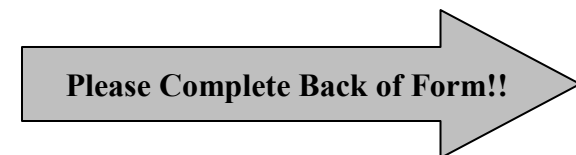

Flower Mix Descriptions:

Bee Feed –

Give back to nature with this gorgeous mix! It provides nectar and pollen to honey bees, wild bees and other pollinators. It is also ideal for borders and garden beds. Enjoy!

This mix is a blend of annual and perennial flowers that provide nectar and pollen to wild bees, honey bees and other pollinators. It is well suited for maintained landscapes such as garden beds, borders and managed meadows. It contains early, mid-, and late blooming flowers in order to provide bee forage all season long. Flowers are suitable for short-tongued and long-tongued bees and come in a wide range of colors for an attractive display.

Prepare a bed of loose soil. Sprinkle seeds in prepared area and cover loosely with soil. Keep the area moist until the plants are about 6" tall. It really is that easy!

Mix includes: Forget-Me-Not, Wallflower, California Orange Poppy, Purple Coneflower, China Aster, Corn Poppy, Lance Leaved Coreopsis, Blue Flax, Baby Blue Eyes, Globe Gilia, Indian Blanket, Tidy-Tips, Plains Coreopsis, Sweet Alyssum, Lavender Hyssop, Fleabane Daisy, New England Aster and Bergamot.

Bird & Butterfly –

This colorful, vibrant mix will attract all of your favorite winged friends! Blooms, nectar and seeds - something for everyone!

Mix includes: Lance Leaved Coreopsis, Indian Blanket, Cosmos, Cornflower, Tree Mallow, Purple Coneflower, Globe Gilia, Shasta Daisy, Annual Phlox, Catchfly, Sweet Alyssum and Foxglove.

Old Glory –

This annual and perennial mixture is a blend of patriotic flower colors. It is our most popular color-themed mixture.

Mix includes: Tall Blue Cornflower, Annual Baby's Breath, Scarlet Flax, Blue Flax, Tall White Sweet Alyssum and Red Corn Poppy.

SUNNY –

A delightfully easy annual mix! Plant it and forget it - until it blooms!

Have a sunny open area ready to become a country wildflower field? We have you covered, quick and simple! Easy to establish, great to view or romp through, and perfect for any open area. Our sunny wildflower mix is a quality blend of bulk wildflower seeds – including black eyed Susan and corn poppy – selected for open areas.

Prepare a bed of loose soil. Sprinkle seeds in prepared area and cover loosely with soil. Keep the area moist until the plants are about 6" tall. It really is that easy!

Prepare a bed of loose soil. Sprinkle seeds in prepared area and cover loosely with soil. Keep the area moist until the plants are about 6" tall. A couple of hours of direct sun per day would be ideal to bring out the best in this mix! Not suitable for densely shaded areas.

Mix includes: Annual Baby's Breath, Crimson Clover, Cornflower, Chinese Forget-Me-Not, Dame's Rocket, Lance Leaved Coreopsis, Sweet William Pinks, Rocket Larkspur, Annual Candytuft, Chinese Houses, Clarkia, Purple Coneflower, Baby Blue Eyes, Snapdragon and Corn Poppy.

What to do with your trees when you get them:

- Keep the roots damp (not soaking in water though)
 - *If the roots look dry upon arrival dip them in a bucket of water and return them the plastic bag they came in and tie the top of the bag closed
- Keep them in a cool dry place (in a garage or unheated basement is usually best)
 - *Do not allow the trees to be exposed to frost or freezing conditions, straw or hay can be used to protect the trees from being too cold but be careful not to allow the straw suffocate the plants if it gets too warm
- Strawberry plants can be stored in the crisper drawer in your fridge until you are ready to plant them

Planting Tips:

- Plant before spring growth starts
- Do not plant if the ground is frozen or waterlogged.
- Do not dig the holes until you are ready to plant (they are likely to become filled with rainwater and waterlogged)
- Dig a hole that will accommodate the roots comfortably with room to spare in every direction
- Loosen the soil at the bottom of the hole with a spade or fork
- Mulch the area around the tree after planting as this insulates the surface and prevents the risk of frost from penetrating and damaging roots.
